

Alberta Population Report

First Quarter, 2007

June 28, 2007

POPULATION ESTIMATES

Alberta's population growth continues to be the highest among all provinces during the first quarter of 2007. As of April 1, 2007, Alberta's population was estimated to be 3,455,062. This produced a yearly growth of 102,800 persons (or 3.07%) for the twelve months ending April 1, 2007. British Columbia and Ontario had the next strongest growth rates among the provinces at 1.34% and 0.87% respectively.

The following table presents the population estimates and yearly growth rates for Canada and Alberta since April 1, 2003.

MIGRATION

Between January 1 and March 31 of 2007, Alberta continued to have the largest interprovincial migration gain in Canada. However, the 7,400 interprovincial migrants gained in the first quarter of 2007 was less than one half of the 15,600 recorded in the previous first quarter.

As shown in Table 3, the primary source of Alberta's interprovincial in-migrants for this quarter was Ontario, followed by British Columbia and Saskatchewan. These three provinces were also the main destinations of out-migrants from Alberta.

NATURAL INCREASE

In the first quarter of 2007, Alberta experienced a natural increase (births minus deaths) of approximately 5,400 people. The province had 10,800 births versus 5,400 deaths during this quarter.
